Teachers and other educators can view progress and track activity on Official SAT Practice for both their classes and individual students. Official SAT Practice Coach Tools make it easier than ever for educators to help their students prepare for the SAT and for college by providing free access to:

- Recommended SAT skills for teachers to work on with their students, based on the needs of their class.
